Current tenant = Thomas Boulton. Annual rent due = £45, in quarterly payments; plus (on every 11th November) 1 bushell of oatmeal, 1 "Settle" Peck of groats (shillings). Nowell could not sell any produce or commodities from the property without Ward's permission. Nowell also responsible for all repairs & maintenance, and to plant 20 Ash into hedgerows each year (he could reclaim the cost of the ash plants from Ward). Nowell <u>not</u> permitted to plough up the Ings, except for Three Nooked Close. During the last 3 years of the lease, ploughing in Three Nooked Close restricted to a maximum of 5 acres per year (or pay penalty of £5 per acre ploughed over that limit). Nowell was also prevented from letting the property without Ward's permission, unless it was to John Abbotson, who was to relinquish possession at the end of the 21 year lease.
