We'll visit this small museum to see the building it's situated in which dates from the 15th century, learn about the local area and the families who have lived there. It's an enjoyable and interesting place with a well-arranged museum and pleasant gardens with a good tea room.

The Museum explains the history of Park Hill farm and the Bannister family, which includes Sir Roger Bannister the famous athlete; as well as the stories of the Pendle Witches and George Fox, founder of the Quakers

Park Hill was a working farm for most of its existence. It grew from a medieval timber-framed building to the house of today. The gardens cover four acres including a hillside Woodland Walk and a Cruck Barn which was rescued and restored to this site by Heritage Trust for the North West

Parking: The car park opposite the Pendle Heritage Centre is Pay and Display, there is a small free on-site car park which can be busy or on-road parking is possible nearby.
