Myles Wallocke, yeoman, Malham &amp; Edward Thompson, yeoman, Over Bordley</p> <p><u>Also mentioned:-</u> Henry Garforth, deceased, of Kilnsey (previous owner of property)</p> <p><u>Witnesses:-</u> Henry Wath[?--] John Wallock</p>
<b>Why ?</b> <i>Purpose of document (eg. Apprenticeship, property transfer, promissory note, arrest warrant, etc)</i> <sup>2</sup>	Property Transfer
<b>Signatories</b>	James Rayner <i>[Wallocke &amp; Thompson's copy]</i>

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<p><b>What?</b></p> <p><i>References to things, events, happenings, topics, etc which should be added to the project Subject Index.<sup>4</sup></i></p> <p><i>Include here references to past events (such as previous property transfers)</i></p>	<p>Myles Wallocke &amp; Edward Thompson paid £500 to James Rayner for property (several fields) which formerly belonged to Henry Garforth (now deceased). This was on the remainder of a two thousand year lease.</p> <p>At Martinmas they were also to pay an annual rent of 1d to James Rayner (implying that James Rayner remained as the formal leaseholder)</p>
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<p><b>Local Issues to note</b></p> <p><i>Anything which should go into the project Timeline as of specific interest to Kilnsey's local history or which raises questions about local affairs<sup>5</sup></i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How did the lease pass from Henry Garforth to James Rayner?</li> <li>• Who was lord of the manor in 1650? Why did the water corn mill belong to James Rayner and not the manorial lord?</li> <li>• Who was using the corn mill? Why was it so valuable in such a small hamlet?</li> </ul>
